

Building Blocks provides neighborhoods in Kalamazoo with organizational and financial support to complete a variety of revitalization projects, from clean-ups to major and minor exterior street-level renovations and repairs, to community gardens and vibrant curbscaping. Building Blocks projects help neighbors meet each other, build and strengthen social capital, resilience, civic engagement, and individual and collective leadership, while improving the exterior look of houses as well as the overall street. Building Blocks' Catalyst Site for 2021 is Park Place from Park St. to Vine St. to S Westnedge Ave. This site was selected as a link between two quadrants of previous catalyst sites with the hope of unifying and sustaining improvements throughout a larger area of the neighborhood. 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Meet the New Historic Preservation Coordinator



Hello, my name is Luis Pena and I was recently hired as the Historic Preservation Coordinator for the City of Kalamazoo. A lifelong Kalamazoo resident, the Westwood neighborhood was my home growing up. I attended Kalamazoo Public Schools and was a proud recipient of the full Kalamazoo Promise scholarship. After graduating from Kalamazoo Central, I attended Western Michigan University and earned a bachelor's degree in English with a focus on rhetoric and writing studies along with a music minor. I was very fortunate to work as an AmeriCorps member with the City of Kalamazoo's Community Planning and Economic Development department after finishing up my undergraduate degree. As an AmeriCorps member, I learned about the positive change that could be made through Community planning, while also discovering historic preservation. When I learned that a profession existed at the intersection of Community Planning and history, local history in particular, I became very interested and was urged to pursue Historic Preservation academically. Once my AmeriCorps service term expired, I enrolled at Eastern Michigan University to earn a master's degree in Historic Preservation. At the conclusion of my graduate studies, I was hired by the city and was thrilled to return to my hometown, as a citizen and an employee. It is my hope that as the Historic Preservation Coordinator I can work to share a more inclusive history of the city, while also making historic spaces and resources equitable and inclusive through preservation.
